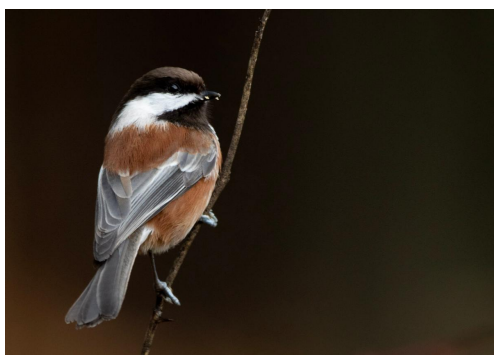




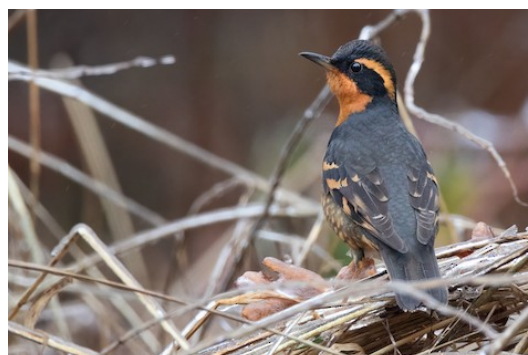

Continent-wide, migration is in full swing. If you're reading this in the Northeast, perhaps you're enjoying your first **Palm Warblers** of the spring. In the Southwest, you may be listening to newly returned **Lazuli Buntings** outside your window. Right now, though, the highest density and diversity of migrants are on the Gulf Coast. Millions of shorebirds and songbirds are hopping across the gulf. Sought-after migrants like **Cerulean Warblers** peak early in the month, while mid-

continent specialties like **Buff-breasted Sandpipers** will arrive about a week behind. Recent arrivals offer unbeatable photography opportunities as they recover from their treacherous journey. Winter residents like **Nelson's Sparrows** and year-round specialties like **Reddish Egrets** are also around! Looking Forward to Summer

It's already April, and summer is just around the corner! Resident birds are nesting across the United States, with migrants pouring in to join them. We want to ensure you get the best of summer birding—from the mountains and prairies of Colorado to the Sky Islands of Arizona. The former will come alive by the end of this month. Breeding activity is best enjoyed from May through July. Lucky birders may be treated to **Black Swifts** nesting behind waterfalls and **Violet-green Swallows** swirling overhead. In Arizona, the monsoon season in late July and August brings the region's best birding. Migrant specialties like **Five-striped Sparrows** and **Painted Redstarts** will be raising young in the mountains. The potential for a show-stopping vagrant like **Eared Quetzal** or **Fan-tailed Warbler** is always at the back of one's mind. Residents like **Mexican Chickadees** and **Spotted Owls** round out an incredible birding experience. Let us help you plan your summer birding adventure!
